On February 20, 2021, 32 members from the Maxwell 4-H Club attended the Washburn Ag & Feed Small and Large Animal Field Day held in Arbuckle, CA. This is my first year of being eligible to sell an animal at the fair, so I was excited to attend the Field Day to see what it was all about. Members were able to attend workshops to learn more about steers, swine, goats and sheep. At each workshop, 4H Members learned from guest speakers on how to properly feed their animals, train them, show them and learned grooming tips as well. In the photo below, Maxwell 4H Club Members Tanner Vierra, Reese Vierra and Erin Dennis watched a demonstration by FFA Member Ryann Dennis on how to show a pig. I learned a lot of valuable information from the session I attended on steers (and I think my dad did too!). We also had the opportunity to complete our YQCA training in person, which is a requirement for all regular 4H Members 9 years and older to exhibit an animal at the fair. Occupancy Limits for UC 4-H Activities and Programs

- When meeting in-person, limit occupancy based on the Occupancy Limit table below. The county's status is posted on the State of California's <u>Blueprint for a Safer Economy.</u> This status is updated every Tuesday. The county status must be checked 7 days before an in-person meeting for any

- Changes.

 Ensure the facility will allow for physical distancing with 36 square feet per person. If there is not enough space for 36 square feet per person, the project leader must reduce the number of people or identify a different facility.

In-Person Occupancy Limits

AS OF Monday, January 25th, the State ended the regional stay-at-home order. This means that each county will now revert back to the state's four risk tiers for re-opening based on **COVID-19** testing and case rates.
