Example statement: This facility is following California Prop. 12 animal confinement standards. Health & Safety Code 25990-25994 Title 3, Chapter 10 of California Code of Regulations Sections 1320-1327.

## YQCA Program Information - updated!!

All market animal exhibitors need to complete their YQCA training. Make sure you complete it and print out your certificate!

## IF you attended the *Washburn Field Day*, in order to get your certificate, you **MUST DO THE** FOLLOWING:

- 1. Complete the pretest in your YQCA profile. If you click on your account, a drop down will have <u>Enrolled ILT Trainings</u>. Click that and the pretest will come up.
- 2. Wait until you are marked complete by the YQCA instructor (this won't happen right away, she will look through them)
- 3. Once you are marked complete, you should receive an email from YQCA
- 4. Click back on your profile and complete the post test. Once you complete it, certificate printing information will come up for you.

California Agriculture Museum in Woodland will lead groups of 4-H'ers through their tractor museum and other agricultural displays!




We have three incubators available for Fall and Spring classrooms! Full incubator & curriculum provided for grades 2-6.

#### 2023 California County Scorecard of Children's Well-Being Children Now

Children Now's 2023 California County Scorecard on Children's Well-being revealed that only <u>31% of Californian fifth graders met or exceeded standards in science in 2022</u>.

The the highest science scores was Santa Clara County (47% of 5th graders), Placer County was second (46%).
