

Countywide Craft Expo

The Countywide Craft Expo will be held on Saturday, November 4, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. in Main Exhibits Building at the Colusa County Fairgrounds. Everyone is welcome to attend, as it is open to the public, so be sure and tell your friends and neighbors!

Stay for the day, and it will count as a Countywide 4-H Arts and Crafts project! Be sure and look for it when you sign up online this year! It will be listed as Arts & Crafts: Countywide Craft Expo.

Adults: If you would like to have a booth and teach a craft project, please contact the office and let us know! Then you can surf the web and Pinterest to pick out your project! It can be a holiday project, but it doesn't have to be!

4-H Members: Pick out a Craft project, get your supplies together, and come and teach it to the attendees, and it can count for Presentation credit!

If you want to be an Arts & Crafts leader this year, this could be the start of your project!

Colusa County 4-H Events Explained

Following are some upcoming 4-H events for this year. Refer to the newsletter for the exact dates.

Butte County Small Animal Field Day - October 14th

This is event is open to everyone. If you are interested in participating at the event please contact the Butte 4-H office at 530-552-5812

Make It, Take It Craft Expo. November

This event allows youth to make and then take home, various craft projects at the material cost, with pieces ranging from .50 cents to \$10.00. This is open to youth of all ages, 5-18. This event is sponsored by the Colusa County 4-H Council.

Chico State Field Day (December)

This event is NOT a 4-H event, but is highly attended by 4-H members. This event includes workshop on best practices with large livestock, and could include nutrition health, fitting, and showmanship.

Presentation Day (January-February)

This event is open to all 4-H'ers allowing youth to exhibit their communication and public speaking skills. Members plan and create a presentation with assistance from the California 4-H Presentation Manual. Pre-registration is required. This event is sponsored by the Colusa County 4-H Council.

Washburn Ag Field Day (April)

This event is NOT a 4-H event, but is highly attended by 4-H members. This event includes showmanship workshops for Beef, Sheep, Swine, Meat Goats, Rabbits, Cavies, Poultry, and Pygmy Goats. Members are also able to practice their judging skills by learning how to place a market class of animals from each breed.

Anything But Animals Still Exhibits Day (March)

This event is open to all 4-H'ers and allows youth to exhibit a variety of entries such as: arts and crafts, woodworking, table settings, and even baked goods. Youth are evaluated on their craft exhibit, as well as a spoken presentation of the items. Pre-registration is required. Youth are given awards based on the Danish system of judging. This event is sponsored by the Colusa County 4-H Council.

Colusa County Fair (June)

This event is NOT a 4-H event, but is highly attended by 4-H members and allows youth to exhibit their

project work. Fair eligibility requirements must be met in accordance to Colusa County 4-H policy.

Colusa County Fair Premium Book Cover Contest

Colusa County Fairgrounds is now accepting entries for the June County Fair Premium Book Cover. The artwork chosen will be used as the cover for the premium book! All ages can enter.

Here are the rules:

The artwork must be flat and scannable Maximum size is 8 x 10, no smaller than 4 x 6 All artwork must be original.

Theme of the fair: Star Spangled Summer

The winner receives \$50 and two fair admission tickets!




Field Trip Opportunity
