Frequently Asked Questions:

How much can irrigation be reduced without hurting a lawn?

It depends on the type of grass that dominates the lawn and the amount of water currently being applied. If the lawn is primarily a cool-season grass and it is being well watered with no obvious drought symptoms, then the amount of water can probably be reduced by 10 to 15 percent without seriously injuring it. Brown areas that develop are often a sign that a sprinkler needs adjusting.

If the lawn is primarily a warm-season grass and you are keeping it well watered, you can probably reduce the amount by up to 25 percent without seriously hurting it.

Always gradually reduce the amount of water applied following the approach described above.
