The Colusa County Master Gardener inaugural year has been eventful.

We logged 952 training hours in the first 17 weeks of the year. After that we hit the ground running with the Colusa Farmers Market, Arbuckle Farmers Market and the Colusa County Fair beginning the first week of June.

Throughout the year we staffed a help desk booth at the Colusa Farmers Market, Arbuckle Farmers Market, Colusa County Fair and Arbuckle Car Show. We also answered questions on a variety of gardening topics at the office help desk at both the UCCE and Farm Bureau Offices.

During the year we logged a total of 616 volunteer and continuing education hours. It's been a busy and productive year. We are looking forward to 2010.
